20. Course Description:

The course introduces students to key trends in contemporary Italian literature spanning from the beginning of Twentieth century to the present day. Students become familiar with prominent authors (Italo Svevo, Alberto Moravia, Leonardo Sciascia and Italo Calvino), delving into their life experiences and examining their literary output thematically and analytically. This analysis includes a focus on elements such as style and language, involving the reading of literary works or excerpts in the Italian language. Furthermore, we take into consideration the historical, political, and philosophical landscape of the 20th century, recognizing its profound impact on the authors under study and their written works. Students will be required to engage in discussions in classroom and onlinein order to be able to read and analyse the "literary texts" and acquire the methods of research in the literary field.
