Objectives of the course:

The course aims to introduce students to Italian poetry between the First and the Second World Wars.

Particular attention will be devoted to three poets: Umberto Saba, Giuseppe Ungaretti and Eugenio

Montale. The student, at the end of the course, will be able to read and analyze the major poems of

these poets.

Learning outcomes:

a) cognitive skills. The student should:

- Read the biographies as well as characteristics of the formal poetry of Saba, Ungaretti and Montale;

- Know the most important works of Saba, Ungaretti and Montale.

- Analyze the texts covered in the course and from the point of view of style and theme;

- Understand the linguistic aspects inherent to the texts treated.

c) Ability practices. The student should:

- Know how to use the poetic terms of the Twentieth century.
