This course offers an up-to-date account of the main concerns, problems, theoretical and practical issues raised by foreign/ second language teaching and acquisition research. Students will be provided with a comprehensive review in this area of applied linguistics, along with a critical overview of the major approaches, questions and hypotheses in areas central to second language theory and practice. We will dedicate a good part of the course to a study of SLA research as it applies to classroom learning and instruction.
