In combination with Russian for Beginners (2), this course introduces students to the basics of Russian language and Russian culture. The aim of the course is to develop communication skills in everyday life and simple situations. The course proposes a full competence in communication strategies and not only a linear assimilation of grammatical knowledge.

#### A- Aims:

1-Develop of starting skills of Russian speech on the basis of conversations and dialogues.

2- Learn the Russian alphabet and develop the initial reading skills.

3- Learn the basics of Russian grammar.

4-Master models starting communication and use them in a live speech.

5-The acquisition of students background knowledge about Russia, about the traditions of the Russian people.
