Course Title: Twentieth-Century English Literature

## **Course Objectives:**

The main objective of this course is to introduce English majors to 20<sup>th</sup> –century English literature through a comprehensive study of a variety of selected literary texts by the major writers of the period. In addition to enhancing the students' literary knowledge, the course aims at improving their language competence and widening their intellectual horizons.
