20. Course Description:

The main objective of this course is to improve the ability of student to present a convincing argument in French language and to develop their ability of responding to other people's counter-argument.

This course helps students to become active speech communicators and critical listeners. Students will learn how to speak confidently and enthusiastically and how to be motivating and persuasive on the platform.

Creative training techniques and methods of reasoning will be examined and studied in depth. Some appropriate written and audio-visual material is to be used.

This course offers students a modern method of learning, through the Blended Learning program. With blended-learning students are given the opportunity to learn by themselves via a partly online designed course syllabus.

This method will give students enough time to work and will help them find their personal learning style. This will create the spirit of cooperation between students because there will be work between groups.

- 4. Discuss general issues concerning nature and function of French language with reference to relevant acquisition principles and implications for teaching and learning.
- 5. Translate professionally from French into Arabic and vice versa employing translation theories and principles.
- 6. Show respect of cultural diversity, ethics, and professional behavior and appreciate the aesthetic and rhetorical aspects in literary works from a variety of cultures.
- 7. Use information and communication technology to access global databases and information to develop his/her knowledge and skills and use them in generating new knowledge in French and English literary and linguistic texts
- 8. Identify scientific research principles and use higher order thinking skills and critical and creative thinking in analyzing and observing issues related to the knowledge and skills of the French language and literature, and to work within a team.
