18. Course Description:

This course aims to give an overview of the novel in the Spanish Twentieth Century, with a special presence

in the agenda of the novel after the Spanish Civil War. The course will focus on theoretical and practical way. On the one hand, an overview of the different literary currents present throughout the century trying to frame them in their historical context is presented. At the same time, we will work from a corpus which includes several fragments of the most representative novels and reading an entire novel: Requiem for a Spanish Peasant JJ Sender.

19. Course aims and outcomes:

A- Aims: The student, at the end of the course, must know the general historical, cultural, humorous, social and psychological features of the Spanish Contemporary Novel.
