

The aim of the course is for the student to develop communication skills in everyday life and in simple situations. The course proposes a full competence in communication strategies based on the four major skills and not only a linear assimilation of grammatical knowledge.

**Course Description** 

3 credit hours 2204127 Korean for Beginners (2) Prerequisite: 2204126

This course involves more advanced grammatical structures of the Korean language, as well as communication strategies in sophisticated situations and in cultural contexts. This course aims at preparing the student to reading and writing while depending on oneself, as well as stimulating situation that require producing dialogues.

**Course Description** 

3 credit hours Korean for Beginners (3) 2204132 Prerequisite: 2204127

The course is regarded as a continuation for the other two Korean courses (Korean for Beginners 1 & 2); it trains the four language skills, listening comprehension, writing, reading, and oral skills, on a more advanced level. After finishing this course, the student will be able to act with self-assurance in everyday life situations. The course contains some new topics such as: description of people's appearance, education and school, entertainment and TV, work and economics in Korea, industry and other more topics related to the Korean society and culture.

**Course Description** 3 credit hours Listening and Conversation/Korean 2204200

Prerequisite: 2204098 or 2204099

This course is mainly designed to enhance oral skills with the aim of practicing communication strategies through a variety of conversations. General subjects will be discussed by means of interaction between the students and the instructor and among students themselves. Students will be trained in listening comprehension through audio-visual aids.

Course Description 3 credit hours Pronunciation and speech/Korean المحاكا والمحاكة 2204205 Prerequisite: 2234131

The course introduces students into the phonetic alphabet and compares both international and Korean

**Course Description** 

2204206 Grammar (1) Korean 3 credit hours
Prerequisite: 2234131

This course concentrates on the description of the basics of Korean morphology and syntax, from a theoretical and practical point of view. Students will be systematically trained in various morphological (word structure and its element) and syntactical (elements of the sentence and its functions and interrelations) processes.

**Course Description** 

2204207 Korean writing 3 credit hours
Prerequisite: 2204098

The aim of this course is to train students in writing free and guided compositions (e.g. narratives, descriptions, letters, etc.). It focuses on the different types of texts and styles of writing depending on the context and intention of the texts (types of speech and writing strategies). General rules of written Korean (accentuation, punctuation, word division, etc.) will also be studied.

**Course Description** 

2204309 Introduction to Korean Literature 3 credit hours
Prerequisite: 2234131

This course introduces students to Korean literature in general. Reading of various literary texts will be based on representative texts in order to familiarize students with literary terminology, the main literary periods and the methods of text interpretation. Students will learn to work in groups. Through group discussions and short presentations about the reading materials they will display better cross-cultural communication skills by comparing different cultures. Besides theoretical knowledge about the Korean literature, the students are expected to continue improving their language competence.

**Course Description** 

2204310 Translation (1) (Korean-Arabic) 3 credit hours

Prerequisite: 2204206

This course trains students to translate Korean texts into Arabic. It highlights general linguistic and cultural difficulties of translation and shows students how to overcome them. It also includes translation of practical texts (e.g. documents, certificates, directions of use, etc.) as well as translation of short literary texts and newspapers articles.

Course Description

2204311 Grammar (2) / Korean 3 credit hours

Prerequisite: 2204206
In combination with grammar (1), the aim of this course is to enrich the students' grammatical

In combination with grammar (1), the aim of this course is to enrich the students' grammatical knowledge of the Korean language. It will introduce students deeper into the various morphological and syntactic processes previously studied.

**Course Description** 

2204312 Korean in The Field of Business 3 credit hours

Prerequisite: 2204207

This course emphasizes advanced oral skills in business situations and specialized vocabulary used in a wide range of Korean business. Korean business etiquettes, Korean customs and culture will be taught. There will be videos showing actual business situations in Korea. Students will be trained on maintaining correspondence with Korean businessmen and on successfully speaking in formal interviews.

At the beginning of the course, students listen to descriptions of different kinds of tourist sites. Advantages and disadvantages of different ways of travelling are discussed. The learners collect information on sites and monuments in Jordan and/or Korea. Students are then asked to give short presentations of these sites and monuments. The special vocabulary necessary to describe archaeological places should be acquired.

**Course Description** 

2204315 Korean in The Field of Media 3 credit hours
Prerequisite: 2204207

In this course participants are introduced to the characteristics of different kinds of media. Students receive an overview about different categories of newspapers, magazines, and television channels. The different kinds of mass media are described and explored in terms of message production. Written or visual materials in mass media are presented to students. Students are encouraged to discuss diverse issues about Korean mass media. Basic knowledge about the Korean press law is gathered.

**Course Description** 

2204317 . Readings of Sino-Korean Texts 3 credit hours

Prerequisite: 2234131

Sino-Korean vocabulary and Sino-Korean characters are necessary for an advanced and superior level of knowledge in Korean. Sino-Korean characters are used differently from the same Chinese characters used in contemporary China in terms of pronunciation, meaning, and word formation. Professional-level Korean speakers need to be able to read at least 1800 Sino-Korean characters. Reinforcement of collocation patterns and semantic association of Sino-Korean vocabulary will be part of this course.
