### **20 Course Description:**

This course is a required one for the first-year students. It is taught along with the course French for specialization 2. It completes what the students learn in the specialization course and gives them the ability to train and apply all the language rules and skills in supplementary exercises that aim at enhancing the language skills namely reading, listening, writing as well as the phonetic and the comprehension skills in both written and spoken French.

This course offers students a modern method of learning, through the Blended Learning program. With blended-learning students are given the opportunity to learn by themselves via a partly online designed course syllabus.
